- The **Haliburton Highlands Genealogy Group** will display transcriptions of all the cemeteries in Haliburton County and a couple bordering ones
- The **Haliburton County Public Library** will show you how to use Ancestry.ca to learn more your family tree and offers a “make and take” craft for the kids

Judging Ballot: Total of 10 points

- CONSISTENCY shape and size of the dozen tarts 1pt, 2pts, 3pts
- PASTRY 1pt, 2pts, 3pts
- OVERALL EXPERIENCE & TASTE 1pt, 2pts, 3pts, 4pts
